

## Our Purpose

Our purpose shall be to promote interest in the heritage and art of quilting, to promote companionship among fellow quilters, and to present an opportunity for increasing knowledge of and appreciation for the art of quilting, both to our members and to the public.



## About the Guild

PPQG began in 1985 as the Newport News Piecemakers and has since evolved into the Peninsula Piecemakers. The Guild currently has over 300 members in two chapters (day and night.)



## Service Projects

Each year, members choose one or more organizations to be the recipient of quilts made specifically for them. Some of the worthy organizations that have received quilts include homeless shelters, nursing homes, hospitals, wounded soldiers and organizations that support children in foster care. Members are encouraged to work on and donate quilts all during the year. Besides finished quilts, tops, orphan blocks, batting, and fabric donations are also appreciated.

## Qualification of Members

Any person over the age of 18 that is interested in promoting the work of the Guild is eligible for membership. Youths 12-18 may join, but must attend with a responsible adult who is also a member



## Programs

Each month we have a program that is either a featured speaker or special activity. We've enjoyed learning new techniques and listening to lectures from nationally known as well as local quilters on subjects as varied as Hawaiian quilting to planning a sewing room. Other programs have included quilt challenges, fashion shows, picnics, holiday parties, etc.

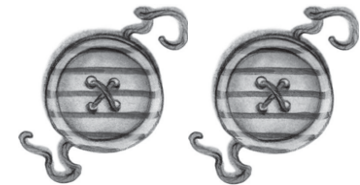


## Monthly Projects

Both Chapters have a Block of the Month Program where members make and have a chance to win a number of blocks. Charm square and fat quarter exchanges are also offered. "Quilting Bees," small gatherings of quilters who meet to work on projects or chat, are coordinated by the Vice President. Bees are usually held in members' homes.

## Annual Activities

Each January, members are challenged to complete a project that must use a certain fabric or reflect a special theme. From 8-10 months are allowed to complete the projects. A Winter/Christmas Mystery project is offered, starting each fall. After following the Mystery directions each month, completed projects are displayed at the December meeting.



## Show and Tell

A favorite activity of Guild members is Show N Tell. During each meeting (usually at the end), members bring in their latest projects, or anything else quilt related that they want to share with their fellow Guild members.



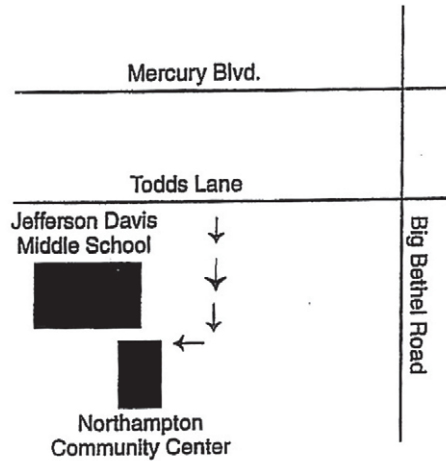
## Other Member Benefits

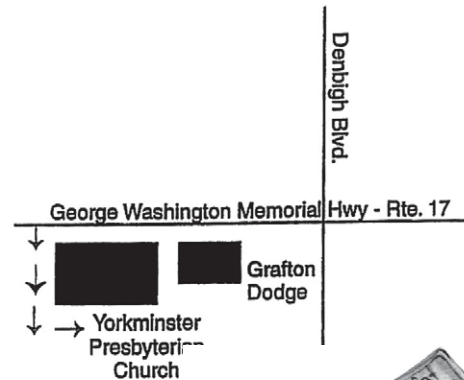
## Inclement Weather

## Membership

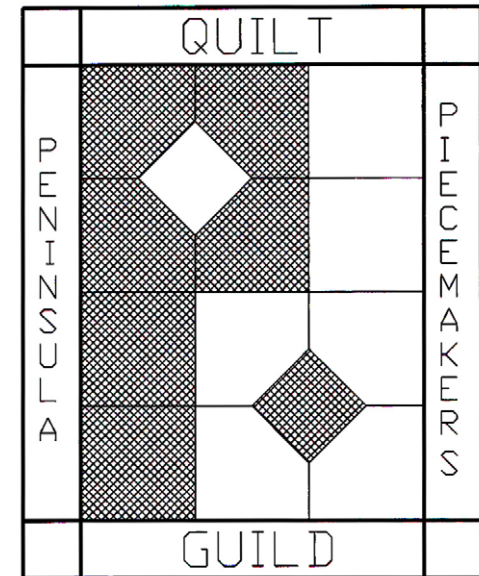
Guests are welcome to attend one meeting.
