- Sheri Overton invited the Guild members to a two-day Angel Quilters Social at St. Andrews Oct 31 and Nov 1. Quilters & Friends shop from Capron will have a fabric sale from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. Friday and 10 a.m. – 3 p.m. Saturday, and there will also be a small quilt show.
